

# Randall elected president of Michigan Townships Association

Roscommon Township Supervisor Diane Randall was recently elected president of the Michigan Townships Association (MTA).

The election took place at the association's annual meeting, held during the 64th annual MTA Educational Conference and Expo, April 13 at the Lansing Center.

"I am honored to serve as the president of the Michigan Townships Association," Randall said. Agency and is a member of the Houghton Lake Ambulance Authority.
